## ROMANS 6:3, 4

3 Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were

baptized into His death?

4 Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

# *What Exactly Do You Bury In Baptism??*

*If Salvation is before*

**BAPTISM,**



*We are BURYING the saved (living)!*

- ◆ *“...buried with Him through baptism into death...”*  
(Rom. 6:4; cf. Col. 3:12).
- ◆ **Will someone tell us how this is being “united together in the likeness of His death” (Rom. 6:5)? Was Jesus buried alive???**

## Romans 6:3-7, "Do you not know?"

### Baptism is "into" Christ Jesus (cf. Gal. 3:27)

- not baptized. . .outside of Christ
- baptized. . .inherit blessings 'In Christ,'  
". . .*who has blessed us with every  
spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in  
Christ*" (Eph. 1:3; cf. 2 Cor. 5:17; 2 Tim. 2:10)

### • Baptism is "into" His death

Jesus shed his blood in his death (Jn. 19:33-34)

## **Romans 6:3-7, "Do you not know?"**

**Baptism is a "burial" with Christ into death (Col. 2:12)**

- If saved before baptism, then are we not burying the living rather than the dead?

**Baptism is a uniting together with Christ (cf. Gal. 3:27; Heb. 10:22)**

- If saved before baptism, then saved without being united with Christ

## **Romans 6:3-7, "Do you not know?"**

**Baptism is a 'burial' of a crucified man and the 'raising' up of a new man (cf. Col. 2:12; 3:1)**

- If saved without baptism, then saved without being raised with Christ

**Baptism involves a doing away of sin (cf. Acts 2:38; 22:16; Col. 2:13)**

- If saved without baptism, then saved without sin being done away with

## Romans 6:3-7, "Do you not know?"

Baptism involves a freeing of sin  
(Rom. 6:2, 16-17)

- If saved without baptism, then saved without being freed from sin

Clearly the apostle Paul saw  
baptism  
as the meeting place of  
"grace" and "faith!"
